All-Time Series vs. Seawolves: Minnesota leads 23-9-2

Series Notes: Minnesota leads the series in Anchorage (8-5-2), and in Minneapolis (15-4-0) • the Golden Gophers own a 6-4-0 edge in the last 10 games • 15 of the last 16 Golden Gopher wins in the series have been by two or more goals, while the last five UAA victories have been by two or fewer goals • Minnesota has prevailed in 11 of the last 12 meetings at Mariucci Arena • six of the last eight two-game sets in the all-time series have resulted in sweeps • UAA is just 2-for-38 (.053) on the power play over the last two seasons against Minnesota • the Golden Gophers and Seawolves have met in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in three of the last four seasons

Last Season vs. Seawolves: Minnesota won four of six meetings with Alaska-Anchorage last season, splitting four regular-season games before the Golden Gophers swept the Seawolves in a WCHA first round playoff series • last season at Sullivan Arena UAA prevailed 5-3 in game one before Minnesota rebounded with a 4-1 victory the following evening • the Golden Gophers scored first in all six games • returning players for the 1999-2000 season scored four of the five goals in last season's first round playoff series • goaltender Adam Hauser has a current shutout streak of 143:54 against UAA • Minnesota was 1-for-14 (.071) on the power play, while UAA was held without a goal (0/19) with the man advantage

News & Notes

The Coaches: Minnesota Head Coach **Don Lucia** is in his first season with the Golden Gophers. Lucia, who has compiled a record of 284-163-29 (.627) in 13 seasons overall as a head coach, led Colorado College to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last four seasons. Lucia was 166-68-18 (.694) in six seasons with the Tigers, and is 122-53-17 (.680) in WCHA games. Lucia is 36-23-6 in 65 career games against Alaska Anchorage, and spent two seasons (1985-87) as an assistant coach with the Seawolves. Lucia spent a total of 12 seasons in the state of Alaska, working six seasons as the head coach at Alaska Fairbanks. Alaska Anchorage Head Coach **Dean Talafous** is in his fourth season at the helm of the Seawolves program, with a record of 34-72-14 (.342) at UAA, and a career record of 144-156-30 in 12 years as a head coach of the Seawolves and at UW-River Falls (alma mater).

Coach Lucia On The Air: Coach Lucia's regular weekly media appearances are as follows: KSTP-AM (1500) - Thursday mornings (7:45) with Barbara Carlson, Saturday mornings (11:50) with Joe Soucheray, and the pre-game and post-game shows before and following games; WCCO-AM (830) - Friday mornings with Dave Lee, and Friday evenings (6:40) with Mike Max; MSC - The Don Lucia Show which airs one hour before each MSC telecast

Schedule Talk: After playing 12 of its first 14 games this season against teams ranked in the top seven in the nation, the Golden Gophers now embark on a portion of the season where they will not face a ranked opponent until a Jan. 21-22, 2000 series against North Dakota. The combined record of the Golden Gophers' first eight opponents (14 games) this season is 69-27-3 (.712) after last weekend's action.

Quick Starts, Slow Finishes: Minnesota has outscored opponents 10-2 in the first 10:00 of games this season, but are on the short end of a 9-2 margin in the final 5:00 of game time. The Golden Gophers own a 15-7 edge overall in the first period of games this season.

Not Playing With A Full Deck: In winning three of its last four games, Minnesota has scored only two 5-on-5 goals. Out of their last 17 goals, 10 have come on the power play and five have been of the 4-on-4 variety. On the season, opponents have outscored Minnesota 26-14 in 5-on-5 play, but the Golden Gophers have the upper hand in all other situations by a 30-21 margin.

Power Play Keys Success: After losing 3-0 at Colorado College on Nov. 5 Minnesota was just 7-for-44 (.159) on the power play, with the reflection being a 1-5-1 record. In the last seven games, in which the team has a 4-3-0 record, the Golden Gophers' power play has heated up to score on 14 of their last 41 man advantage opportunities (.341).

Get 'Em Early: Minnesota is 5-0-1 this season when leading after two periods, but is 0-5-0 when trailing after two frames - the Golden Gophers have not won in their last 36 games they have trailed after two periods (0-31-5).

On The Road - Again: The Golden Gophers will leave the Twin Cities on Wednesday evening for Anchorage in preparation for the weekend series against the Seawolves. Including the Thursday to Sunday trip to the College Hockey Showcase last weekend, that means in an 11-day stretch the Golden Gophers will be on the road for nine days - Minnesota returns on Sunday, Dec. 5 from Anchorage. After returning home, however, the Golden Gophers will leave the state of Minnesota only two more times (Jan. 21-22 at North Dakota; Feb. 18-19 at Michigan Tech) for games the entire season.

Handling Jet Lag: Minnesota has an impressive 17-5-6 (.714) record this decade the weekend following two successive weekends on the road. The team will be back home next weekend to play St. Cloud State after two straight weekends away from Mariucci Arena. The Golden Gophers are 8-8-0 (.500) in the weekend following the Alaska Anchorage trip in the 1990s.

In State Domination: Minnesota is 32-10-5 (.734) against teams from the state of Minnesota (St. Cloud State, Minnesota-Duluth, Minnesota State, Mankato) in the last six seasons.

Better November: By ending the month with a 4-4-0 mark in November, the Golden Gophers have reversed a negative trend of the last two seasons. Minnesota had been 3-13-1 in the last two seasons during November.

Did You Know: Minnesota is 6-5-0 on Dec. 3 and 4-6-1 on Dec. 4 in school history • the Golden Gophers' 6-1 win at Michigan last Friday was the team's first five-goal or more margin of victory on the road since a 5-0 win at Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 16, 1995, and the program's largest margin of victory at Michigan since a 10-1 win on Jan. 5, 1979 • the Golden Gophers have scored at least one power-play marker in 12 of 14 games this season • Minnesota's first six road games were decided by a total of nine goals - last weekend's two games at the College Hockey Showcase were decided by a total of nine goals • the team leads the WCHA in power-play stats (league games only, 12/42, .286) and is second in all games (21/85, .247) • Minnesota has the third-fewest penalty minutes in league games (15.0 per game) • the Golden Gophers rank third in the WCHA in net special teams (+5)
