

DULUTH--The fifth annual UMD Student Leadership Seminar will be held Friday and Saturday (May 4-5) sponsored by the Student Association and the Office of Student Personnel Services.

Objectives of the seminar are to aid individual students in learning more about group problems and solutions, in gaining insight into their own behavior as participants in groups, and in teaching human relations skills.

Edwin O. Siggelkow, director of student activities, will welcome representatives from various college campuses in Minnesota at 4:30 p.m. Friday in Social Science 116. Evening sessions will concentrate on problems of campus organizations and the orientation of new students. Dr. Armas W. Tamminen, head of psychology at UMD, will lead the theory sessions.

A film on "Group Dynamics" will be shown Saturday morning by Dr. Philip C. Walther, assistant professor of psychology, following discussions on group functions.

Five UMD students who attended the Leadership Training Laboratory at Bethel, Maine last year will give role-playing demonstrations and serve as resource persons to small-group discussions. The leaders will be Linda Makinen, Keewatin; Rosemarie Russo, Keewatin; James Hagenbrock, Duluth; Janet K. Johnson, Duluth; and Susan Franz, Duluth.

The case method of solving problems will be used Saturday afternoon in sessions on the topic "Blair State", a freedom of student press issue.

The seminar will end with a banquet at 6:00 p.m. at Kirby Student Center ballroom. Dr. Tamminen will direct a "summary" session to conclude the seminar.
