Notice to Freshmen.—If you entered College as a beginning Freshman in September, you presumably registered for both fall and winter quarters. If you did not register for the winter quarter, or if you need to make a change of registration, you will have to do so in Room 106, Folwell Hall, before December 15.

College of Engineering and Architecture

All students must complete their registration for the winter quarter by presenting their fee statements and receiving their class schedules on Wednesday, January 3, 1923, in Room 201, Main Engineering Building.

Students who have cancelled any course, or who have been dropped from any course for which registered during this fall quarter, must re-register on January 3.
