DULUTH--More than 100 UMD freshmen are winding up orientation-registration week in the pine-scented, peaceful atmosphere at Camp Miller on Sturgeon Lake.

Four busloads of the still-peppy freshmen traveled to Camp Miller Thursday afternoon under the direction of Edwin O. Siggelkow of the Office of Student Personnel Services.

The YMCA-owned Camp Miller will be operated through Saturday (Sept. 26) by UMD faculty and upperclassmen. The 105 registered freshmen will be further oriented to college life through discussion groups, skits, sports, dances, movies and campfire sessions.

Upperclassmen Beatrice Lee and Duncan Steinman are camp co-chairmen with Marge Papke acting as advisor. Each cabin is under the charge of one upperclass counselor.

Camp will break up Saturday in time for the freshmen to attend the UMD-Gustavus football game at Public Schools Stadium (7:30 p.m.) and for the post-game street dance behind Kirby Student center sponsored by the UMD International club. This year's Freshmen Princess will be crowned Sunday night during the talent show at Kirby to wind up seven days of frosh activity.
