Ensemble Music Program Planned

A program of ensemble music under the direction of James E. Smith and Robert E. Beverley will be presented on Tuesday, March 27, at 8:00 p.m. in Tweed Hall.

Featured works will be Bela Bartok's "Contrasts" and Beethoven's String Quartet No. 11, Opus 95. "Contrasts" is a unique piece of chamber music in which the jazz influence is occasionally revealed quite openly but more often in a subtle manner. Written for a seldom-heard combination of instruments--violin, clarinet, and piano-- it was originally performed by Benny Goodman and Joseph Szigeti. Mr. Smith, Mr. Beverley, and Mr. Robert Nelson will present the work at the Tuesday concert.

Beethoven's String Quartet No. 11, Opus 95 will be performed by Janet McEldowney and Lois Johnson, 1st and 2nd violins; James E. Smith, viola; and Alfred Dillan, cello. The remainder of the program will be devoted to works for a woodwind quintet. Members of the quintet are Janet Kristensen, flute; John McEldowney, oboe; William Moody, clarinet; James Hoffren, horn; and Thomas Jacobson, bassoon.
