DULUTH -- The registration deadline for the 1963 UMD Freshman Camp has been set for September 6 (Friday). Any freshman or advanced standing transfer student planning to attend should register immediately to avoid being turned down if the camp fills up early.

The co-educational encampment will be held September 13, 14 and 15 at "Y" camps Miller and Wanakiwin. The two camps have a combined total capacity of approximately 200 persons.

Students who have misplaced or not yet received an application form may obtain one by contacting the Freshman Camp office, 120 Kirby Student Center, University of Minnesota, Duluth, Duluth 12, Minnesota.

Linda Gunderson of Moose Lake and David H. Peterson of Duluth, co-chairmen of the camp, expect a heavy turnout with the prospects of a large freshman class this fall.

The camp reflects both the academic and social life at UMD. The activities are geared to prepare new students for everything from scheduling classes to wearing beanies.
