This year's speaker is Dr. Lisa Lampert, who will deliver a presentation titled,
"Race and the New Medievalism"

Dr. Lampert is currently an assistant professor at the University of California, San Diego. She received her Ph.D. in English Literature from the University of California, Berkeley, and has published on Middle English Literature and modern German-Jewish literature. Her teaching interests include medieval and early modern English literature, medieval women writers, Middle High German literature, literary representations of Jews and Judaism, and feminist theory. Her forthcoming book is titled, *After Eden, Out of Zion: Jews and Gender from Paul to Shakespeare*. Other publications include:

In her Jankofsky lecture, Dr. Lampert will address questions of race, anti-Semitism, periodicity and a trend in recent international relations theory called neo-medievalism (related to the infamous "clash of civilizations" thesis) with reference to Wolfram von Eschenbach's *Parzival*.
