HONORED-----Thomas Bydalek, Robert Heller and James Nichol have recently been chosen Outstanding Educators of America for 1973. This is an annual awards program honoring distinguished men and women for their exceptional service, achievements and leadership in the field of education.....Major William Desmond was awarded the Major Francis F. McGouldrick Award at the National Arnold Air Society Conclave held in Salt Lake City on March 30. This award was presented to Major Desmond for being the Outstanding Angel Flight Advisor in the nation.
