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Duluth--- Mona Dayton, the U.S. "Teacher of the Year" in 1966 will instruct a workshop at UMD this summer on the special techniques of teaching by inquiry.

Mrs. Dayton will join Dr. W. C. Gemeinhardt, asst. professor of education at UMD, on the faculty of the workshop to be held July 8-19.

Mrs. Dayton was a first grade teacher in Tucson, Arizona when she was selected the nation's outstanding teacher. She received the award from President Johnson in a special White House ceremony. She has been a summer demonstration teacher and workshop director at the University of Arizona since then, and this year is conducting a series of workshops on the inquiry method of teaching at Southampton College, Southampton, New York.

The UMD workshop sponsored by the University of Minnesota General Extension Division, is designed for teachers and administrators with elementary school teaching experience. Workshop students will become acquainted with, develop facilities in the use of, and evaluate the results of inquiry techniques in teaching.

Topics to be considered include how to personalize teaching, creative teaching, using inquiry techniques with various curriculum organizations at all grade levels, establishing thinking patterns, and innovating through television.

Students may earn three credits in EDCI 100 as either graduate or undergraduate work.

Applications for the workshop must be received by June 24. The fee for the entire workshop is \$60. Applications should be sent to Dr. C. M.
