Duluth-- The annual UMD Student Art Show, one of the largest exhibitions of the year at Tweed Gallery, will begin with a formal public opening at 8 p.m. Wednesday, May 29.

Up to 400 works of art will be on display, according to William G. Boyce, associate director of the gallery. The student show will run through July 7.

Due to be presented for the first time will be Maurices Annual Graduate Purchase Award sponsored by Maurices Apparel Shops in Duluth.

Announcement will be made of the Alice Tweed Tuohy Purchase Awards in painting, sculpture, drawing, ceramics, design study and prints. The award-winning works will be made part of the permanent collection of the UMD Department of Art.

Merit Award ribbons for works in the same category will be presented by Art department faculty. Also to be announced will be the Kirby Student Center Fine Arts Award which will be displayed permanently in Kirby Center.

Some of the student art will be on sale to the public.

Works from the George P. Tweed Memorial Art Collection will be exhibited in the Alice Tweed Tuohy Room. The smaller Studio Gallery will feature Alice Tweed Tuohy Purchase Awards from 1965, '66 and '67.

Tweed Gallery is open from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday; until 9 p.m. each Wednesday; and from 2 - 5 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday.
