Duluth--- Seventy-four UMD art majors will make their annual field trip Wednesday (Jan. 15) to view exhibits in Minneapolis.

Eight faculty members and 15 guests also will accompany the students, according to J. Dorrance Kiser, assistant professor of art and trip director.

The group will leave the UMD campus by bus at 6:30 a.m. and go directly to the University's Minneapolis campus gallery to view these exhibits there: French Print Makers, Richard Haas---MFA Thesis, and Chinese Rubbings.

Following lunch at Coffman Memorial Union, the group will go to the Minneapolis Institute of Art to see three exhibits: Four Centuries of American Art, Three Centuries of American Prints, and a Century of American Photography.

A final trip will be made to the Walker Art Center to view exhibits by Jacques Lipchitz, prints by Roberto Delamonica and the gallery's permanent collection.

Following dinner in Minneapolis, the group will return to Duluth.
