FALL QUARTER FINAL REPORTS

All members of the teaching staff are reminded that under the regulations of the University Senate, final reports for the fall quarter are due at the Registrar's office, not later than 12:00 o'clock noon, Wednesday, December 21, 1927. The Registrar's office will make every effort to have the final grades for the fall quarter recorded, and reports sent to the students before the winter quarter opens, in order to facilitate the winter quarter registration procedure. This will make it possible to give complete and accurate information promptly to faculty committees, advisers and other administrative officers, who may need the records in dealing with students, and will also permit students to make necessary changes in registration, before the opening of the quarter.

It will be possible to do this only if instructors with examinations on December 14 and 15, will file their reports before the last day. It is requested that such reports be filed by December 17, 1927, and that, in general, all instructors file their reports as early as possible.

The co-operation of each member of the teaching staff is solicited. Blank forms for the reports may be secured at the departmental offices, or by calling the Registrar's office.

Winter Quarter Fees

1. Statements covering the winter quarter fees have been mailed to the post office boxes of all students now registered at the University, with the exception of students registered in the College of Education. These students will receive their statements as they complete their advance registration. December 21st is the last date for payment of the same without penalty. **PAYMENTS RECEIVED AFTER THAT DATE MUST BEAR A POSTMARK PRIOR TO 12 O'CLOCK MIDNIGHT ON DECEMBER 21ST TO AVOID PENALTY.** The penalty for late payment is \$2.00 until January 4th; it increases at the rate of \$1.00 per day beginning on that date. Students are cautioned against mail delays which may be occasioned by holiday congestion, and are urged to remit fees far enough in advance of December 21st to avoid possible complications. Students who must write home for money or make loans are specially urged to complete such arrangements within the time limit in order to avoid the penalty.

2. Fee statements are issued on the basis of the records as they now appear. Approved petitions or memoranda modifying the records, and consequently the fees, must be filed within the time limit. **IF NOT, THE STUDENT MUST PAY THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE STATEMENT, AND SECURE A SUBSEQUENT REFUND IF NECESSARY.**

3. Remittance must be for the exact amount of the fee statement; the Bursar cannot accept checks, drafts, or money orders in excess of the same. **INSUFFICIENT OR INCORRECT REMITTANCES WILL BE RETURNED TO THE STUDENT AT HIS OWN RISK, AND STUDENTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PENALTIES THAT MAY BE INCURRED BY THIS ACTION.** Students will likewise be responsible for penalties or delays caused by non-negotiable checks or drafts.

4. All checks, drafts and money orders should be made payable to The University of Minnesota. In remitting by mail, checks should be mailed to the Bursar's office of the University. **ALL THREE SECTIONS OF THE FEE STATEMENT MUST ACCOMPANY THE REMITTANCE.**

5. FAILURE TO RECEIVE A FEE STATEMENT CANNOT BE ACCEPTED AS A SUFFICIENT REASON FOR LATE PAYMENT OR NON-PAYMENT OF FEES. Any student who does not receive a fee statement in his post-office box may secure a duplicate statement at his college window in the Registrar's office. Students whose work takes them from the campus must inform the registrar's office of their change of address.

6. Trainees of the U. S. Veterans Bureau, the State Division of Re-Education, Foreign Government Students and the beneficiaries of the scholarship funds of miscellaneous agencies, must secure the written endorsement of the Assistant Registrar on their fee statement, and present them to the Bursar within the time limit, to avoid the penalty.

7. Students who plan to register in another college next quarter should not pay the fee statement sent to them. These students will register as new students in the college they plan to enter, and will pay fees at the time of registration. Their registration will not be complete until the fees of the college in which they plan to register have been paid.

COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, AND HOME ECONOMICS

Notice to All Students

It has been the assumption in the past that classes on the Minneapolis campus composed exclusively of students from the College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Home Economics, would have examinations conducted under the honor system. Because of many difficulties involved in the use of the honor system under the conditions which exist where practically all of the other classes are under the proctor system and because of the confusion which arises because of these difficulties, the Students' Council has withdrawn the request that such classes be under the honor system. In the future, therefore, all classes on the Minneapolis campus will be under the proctor system or under such system of conducting examinations as may prevail in the respective colleges. All classes on the University Farm campus will continue under the honor system except where this privilege has been specifically withdrawn.

Registration for the winter quarter for all students now in residence will be held on December 15 and 16. Home Economics seniors will register on December 15 and all other Home Economic students, on December 16. The Home Economics advisers will be in Room 202, Administration Building, on those days. Agriculture and Forestry students may register on either December 15 or 16, and will go to the office of their advisers for consultation. Students who have been issued grade book folders by the Registrar's office should bring these folders with them when they consult their advisers concerning their program. After the adviser has approved the program, the

student should complete the registration forms and turn them in at the Registrar's office before 5 p.m. Friday, December 16.

Fees for the winter quarter must be paid not later than December 21. The usual penalty of \$2 will be charged for registration after December 16 or for payment of fees after December 21. This penalty will increase at the rate of \$1 per day after the opening of the winter quarter.

Grades for the fall quarter will be mailed to students living in the Twin Cities and placed in the post-office boxes of all other students on December 28. Changes in program necessitated by failures in fall quarter courses should be made on December 30 and 31 and must carry the approval of the adviser.
