Duluth -- While national organizations^s are announcing results of their latest presidential polls, the UMD Student Association has been polling UMD Student preferences for president.

Results of the latest UMD poll announced lat^e last week showed Richard Nixon leading Vice President Humphrey by a 41 per cent to 38 per cent margin. Third-party candidate George Wallace received 2 per cent, and other candidates received 11 per cent. Eight per cent of those polled had no opinion.

According to Greg Fox, Duluth, SA public relations commissioner, the student polls have follow^ed national ^{trends} ~~trends~~ for Nixon and Humphrey. The polling was made by calling 100 students selected at random from the student directory.

In the latest Harris Survey released last Friday, the tabulation was Nixon, 40 per cent; Humphrey 37 per cent; Wallace 16 per cent; and undecided, 7 per cent. The Gallup Poll released today showed Nixon ahead of Humphrey by a 42 per cent to a 40 per cent margin; Wallace received 14 per cent and 4 per cent of those polled had no opinion.

The Student Association will also hold a mock election for president on Tuesday.
