On their 14th tour of the U. S., the celebrated Vienna Choir Boys of St. Stephens will appear on the UMD campus at 8 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 30, under auspices of the department of concerts and lectures and the student convocation and lectures committee.

The concert, divided into three parts, will open with a group of sacred songs written in the 16th and 17th centuries.

After a brief intermission, a group of boy singers will present a miniature operetta. High-heeled shoes, dresses and wigs will be worn for the musical drama.

Concluding feature will be a program of secular music and folk songs.

The troupe of more than 20 boys, ranging in age from eight to 14, will be carrying on a Vienna Choir Boy tradition that began in 1498 when Emperor Maximilian I established the choir by Imperial decree.
