Duluth--- Articles by two UMD faculty members have been published in recent issues of state-wide magazines.

"Speaking of Indians -- What's Your Problem?" an article by Dr. Dean A. Crawford, professor of secondary education, appears in the November issue of the Minnesota Journal of Education. In it, Crawford attacks the stereotype of the dishonest, lazy American Indian and examines the bases for those attitudes. He traces the Indian way of life and shows that the greatest misunderstandings result from conflicts between the Indian value system and the dominant society's value system.

Crawford's article is a result of a nine-month stay on Indian reservations during 1967. While there he studied the teaching of Chippewa children and later published a book entitled "Minnesota Chippewa Children: A Handbook for Teachers" with co-authors David L. Peterson, Cook County elementary principal and Virgil Wurr, elementary principal at Nett Lake.

Dr. Julius F. Wolff, professor of political science, published an article on Lake Superior shipwrecks in the Oct. 27 issue of Picture Magazine, the supplement to the Minneapolis Sunday Tribune. It reviews some of the more spectacular shipwrecks during the last half century.

Dr. Wolff has researched and written about Lake Superior shipwrecks for a number of other magazines.
