### LEGISLATURE DAY

Today the State Legislature will visit the University of Minnesota. A convocation will be held at 11:30 a.m. in the Armory. Members of the Legislature will be seated on the stage. Governor J. A. O. Preus, Lieutenant-Governor Louis L. Collins, President of the Senate, Representative W. I. Nolan, Speaker of the House, and President Coffman will make brief addresses.

Following the convocation the guests will be entertained at luncheon in the ballroom of the Minnesota Union. In the afternoon the guests will visit the different parts of the Campus. As they expect to see the University under normal conditions it is understood that all class and laboratory work will go on as usual without interruption. Following is a brief program of the day:
