Duluth--- Words will be the weapons next Monday (Oct. 30) when two UMD debaters join forces with two members of the British International Debate Team. The debate topic will be "Resolved: That Private Morality is no Concern of the Law."

The debate will take place in Kirby Ballroom at 10:30 a.m. The format will be 10-minute speeches by each speaker, followed by questions from the audience.

Taking part will be UMD students Fred Friedman and Jeffrey R. Latts, both juniors and members of the UMD debate team. One will take the affirmative stand with E. William Smyth, a graduate of University College in Dublin, Ireland. The other will argue the negative with Michael Tugendhat, a graduate of Gonville and Caius College in Cambridge, England.

Both Smyth and Tugendhat currently are on a fall debate tour of the United States. They were chosen for the tour through competition with other debaters.

Thomas J. Pollack, debate coach at UMD, will host the program sponsored by the Speech Association of America.
