DULUTH--- If you're interested in knowing how to track an earth satellite or intrigued by the workings of a wind tunnel, visit the UMD Science Fair beginning at 8:30 a.m. Saturday (April 10).

Those are just two of the science displays entered in the 11th annual competition for junior and senior high school students, according to Fair Director Donald Jackson, assistant professor of engineering.

About 100 entries are expected. Other exhibits will include displays of electronic power, a portable hydrophone, the magnetic separation of iron from taconite ore, the human skeleton and rockets and fuels.

Dr. Richard L. Varco, a University of Minnesota professor known for his work in heart surgery, will speak on "Human Biology: The Challenges in Experiments of Nature" at 10:30 a.m. in Science Auditorium.

A professor in the University's Department of Surgery, Dr. Varco's appearance is sponsored by the Duluth Clinic Foundation.

The judging of student exhibits will take place Friday evening (April 9). The top exhibitor will receive a \$100 scholarship check from Minnesota Power and Light, Duluth.

Winners in the Northeastern Minnesota Regional Essay Contest also will be recognized during the Fair.
