DULUTH--- A Driver Education Workshop sponsored by the Educational Research and Development Council of Northeast Minnesota (RAND) will be held November 4-5 in the Duluth Arena-Auditorium.

The workshop is made possible through the cooperation of the All-State and Aetna Insurance Companies, according to Dr. Wesley T. Shepard, executive secretary of the RAND Council.

The two-day sessions open at 9:45 a.m. Nov. 4 with a welcome to area teachers and administrators from Dr. Shepard following registration beginning at 9 p.m.

Harry C. Brown, director of safety education for Duluth Public Schools, is directing the workshop. He will be chairman of the sessions on the first morning.

Robert L. Marshall, associate executive secretary of the National Commission on Safety Education for the National Education Association, will talk on "Making the Best Use of Federal Funds--The National Highway Safety Act" at 10 p.m.

Sigurd J. Ode, assistant commissioner of education for Minnesota, will speak on "Legislation and Driver Education at the State Level" at 10:40 a.m. and Robert Provost of the Minnesota Insurance Center will discuss "Insurance as it Relates to Driver Education" at 11:20 a. m.

The first afternoon will be devoted to demonstrations of the Driver Trainer Simulator by representatives of All-State and the Driver Educator device by representatives of Aetna.

Dr. William A. Mann, professor of education at Michigan State University, will be guest speaker at a 6 p.m. dinner in the Arena-Auditorium. His topic: "Psychological Aspects of Driver Education."
