If you think you're busy, try Clifford Jacobson's schedule.

Prime candidate for UMD's BMOC (busiest man on campus) title, Clifford somehow combines these activities:

- Student pastor of Bethany Lutheran church at Poplar and Trinity church at Lake Nebagamon, Wis.
- Part-time janitor at Salem Lutheran church in Hermantown, on Duluth's outskirts.
- Part-time stock clerk at a supermarket in Piedmont Heights, Duluth.
- Full-time student at UMD, including the current session.

In his eighth quarter at UMD, Jacobson started out as a business major, switched to pre-theology when he saw increasing need for spiritual workers and leaders in 20th century life.

"Every day I would see evidence of that need. I just concluded that I was meant to serve in the ministry."

He puts 400 or 500 miles on a 1956 model car each week, including the 100-mile Sunday circuit of Poplar and Lake Nebagamon. He shares the car with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Vernon T. Jacobson, 2909 Haines road, Duluth.

"One activity serves another," he explains as he describes how an incident in the supermarket or on campus fits into his Sunday preaching.

The church work is giving him important experience in many areas, "from recognizing the invaluable help of an experience usher to handling the problem of crying babies with patience and tact."

Next fall he will assume the pulpit at Bennett, Wis., Lutheran church. When he completes the B. A. degree at UMD, with a major in speech and a minor in history, he will enroll at Augustana seminary, Rock Island, Ill.
