### PRIZE OFFERED

An anonymous friend of the University has donated the sum of \$20 to be awarded as a prize to the member of the junior or senior classes who, in a competition, will show the largest proficiency in cataloging books according to the rules of the University Library.

Students who desire to contest for this prize are requested to hand their names to the Librarian on or before March 15. The contest will be held on the afternoon of April 17.

The contestants will be expected, before that date, to have studied the Library catalog, the rules for cataloging and the various reference books used by catalogers. A memorandum embodying detailed suggestions for such study will be given to each contestant.

On the date of the contest, each student will be given, by lot, two books for which he will prepare manuscript cards of the type used in the catalog of the University Library.

The prize will be awarded by a committee consisting of Miss Goss, Head Cataloger of the University Library, Miss Patten, Librarian of the Athenaeum Library, and Miss Rosholt, Head Cataloger of the Public Library.
