# CAMBODIA:

## HERE WE GO AGAIN!

RECENT STATEMENT BY SENATOR MANSFIELD: "If we are not careful, we have got the makings of another Vietnam."

TO WHICH SENATOR JAVITS COMMENTED: "These words should be carefully heeded by all in Congress and the Executive, especially in light of the recent tragic chapter of history in Vietnam."

### ARE YOU WILLING TO DO IT AGAIN?

U. S. casualties are beginning again: at least 2 dead, 2 wounded and 4 missing. And will the U.S. POW's in Cambodia be used as rationale for staying in Cambodia?

### ARE YOU WILLING TO DO IT AGAIN?

Cambodian civilian casualties are at 1,000 a day - 45% of hospital facilities have been destroyed - 1/3 to 1/2 of the population (at the very least 2 million people) have had to flee their homes.

### ARE YOU WILLING TO DO IT AGAIN?

Do the young men of this country again have to face a decision to fight in an undeclared war or go to jail or leave the country? Do sons, brothers, husbands have to die in Cambodia this year?

# URGENT - ACT NOW!

- \* The Fy '73 DOD Supplemental Appropriations Bill is now before the Congress and will soon go to the Senate. Rather than straight forwardly requesting more money for Indochina, the Pentagon has asked for increased transfer authority within the Department of Defense budget (that is authority to take funds from one section of the budget and spend them elsewhere). Of the \$500 million in new "flexibility" requested, \$150-300 million is earmarked for bombing Cambodia. If it is approved, the Nixon administration would have the same blank check for war that the Johnson administration had with the Gulf of Tonkin resolution.

WRITE, PHONE OR WIRE YOUR CONGRESSPERSON AND URGE HIM NOT TO SUPPORT THIS BILL.

- \* The Case-Church amendment would prohibit financing "United States military forces in hostilities in or over or from off the shores of North Vietnam, South Vietnam, Laos, or Cambodia unless specifically authorized hereafter by Congress." This will probably go to the Senate floor in mid-May.
