Students Prepare for National Crops Contests in Kansas City and Chicago

Some team practices are quieter than others and none more so than the intense preparation for collegiate crops judging.

University of Minnesota Crookston students Malia Martin, a sophomore majoring in agronomy and animal science from Appleton, Wis., and Timothy Ames, a senior agriculture major from Crookston, Minn., have been hard at work getting ready for the upcoming Collegiate Crops Judging contests.



The Kansas City contest takes place on Tuesday, November 15 and the contest in Chicago is Saturday, November 19. Students competing in collegiate crops judging are coached by Rob Proulx, who teaches agronomy in the Agriculture and Natural Resources Department.
