For example: A class meeting first hour on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday should report for final examination on Wednesday, December 16, 8:00-10:00, at the time scheduled for first hour Monday, Wednesday, Friday classes and not at the time scheduled for the first hour Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday classes.

All instructors are asked to observe this principle in order to avoid concentration of examinations and conflicts
