THE LEAGUE TO ENFORCE PEACE will hold a convention in Minneapolis on Wednesday and Thursday, January 8 and 9. It is expected that the sessions the second day will be held at the University, and that former President Taft will speak at an all-University convocation on Thursday at 11:30.

DR. HARRY EMERSON FOSDICK of Union Theological Seminary, New York City, will be at the University on January 23-26, 1919. He will come at the invitation of the President and the Y. M. C. A., and will speak at an all-University convocation on Thursday, January 23, at 11:30, and be available for personal conferences.

SPECIAL RATE TO UNIVERSITY STUDENTS FOR CONFERENCE BASKET BALL GAMES

The University Athletic Board of Control at its last meeting voted a special rate of admission, to the five home Conference basket ball games, of fifty cents. Regular prices are one dollar for the Wisconsin and Illinois games, and seventy-five cents for the Indiana, Purdue, and Iowa games. Student tickets will be on

sale at the Athletic Manager's office in the Armory building up to 12:00, noon, of the day of the game. Only students and members of the University are entitled to the special rate, and purchasers must apply in person, and identify themselves.

Tomorrow evening (Saturday) at eight o'clock, in the Armory building, the University basketball team will meet the strong Stout Training School team in the last preliminary game of the season.

THE HOME CONFERENCE basket ball season will open on Saturday, January 11, and following is the home schedule: Jan. 11, Indiana; Jan. 18, Wisconsin; Jan. 27, Illinois; Feb. 8, Iowa; and Feb. 15, Purdue.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

The University Health Service has been requested to vacate its present quarters at 1515 University avenue. Every effort is now being made to secure another location and to install itself therein.

In the meantime, the health service will endeavor to perform its functions and duties without interruption. Due announcement will be made of its new location as soon as this is determined.

Physicians are in attendance at the University Health Service during the following hours:

8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. daily
11:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Monday to Saturday
2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday to Friday
4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday to Saturday

While the University Health Service is open at all hours to emergency calls, students are requested to observe these hours for consultation.

The service is extremely anxious to be of utmost satisfaction to all. Any criticisms for apparent neglect or suggestions relative to the improvement of the service will be deeply appreciated by the director.

Is there a need for a University Health Service? The following is a report of the personal activities of the service from the opening of the present school year October to December 17, 1918:

Total number of hospital cases.....	300
Total number of visits to dispensary.....	5,905
Total number of outside calls.....	110
Total number of examinations, civilians.....	1,264
Total number of laboratory examinations.....	350
Total	7,929

More than 8,000 visits were made to the University Health Service during the months of October, November, and December.

This report does not include the S. A. T. C. medical activities which totals more than 12,000 individual services.

Only the personal phase of the University Health Service is included in the above report. It is now making extensive plans to increase the activities of its division of sanitation. Every rooming and boarding house will be inspected and regulations made covering the sanitation of these places.

Likewise the activities of its division of education will be increased.

The Committee on Intra-Mural Sports and Physical Education announces that endeavors are now being made to provide facilities for all outdoor winter sports and exercises. Provisions for skating are now being made and the rink will be open to students in the very near future. Announcements will be made of the various places for outdoor sports as soon as the facilities are ready.

It is urgent that all students take some form of outdoor exercise daily. Just try it and see if increase of mental efficiency is not the result as well as enhancement of your health.
