Duluth--- Two courses in Shakespeare and one in child psychology will be offered via television during the coming academic year by the University of Minnesota's General Extension Division.

The Television College courses can be taken either for University credit or for self-enrichment by residents of Northeastern Minnesota by watching WDSE-TV, the Duluth educational station. The telecasts originate at KTCA-TV, Minneapolis-St. Paul.

The fall quarter course on Shakespeare (English 55) will be presented at 9:30 p.m. on Wednesdays and Fridays beginning Sept. 28 and continuing through Dec. 6.

Sarah Youngblood, associate professor of English on the Minneapolis campus, will present readings of selected plays from the early and middle period of Shakespeare's writings. Six plays will be studied for their theme, plot, structure and analysis of characters.

Professor Youngblood also will teach the course on Shakespeare during winter quarter, Jan. 4-March 17. Several professors will lecture during spring quarter, Feb. 14-June 8 for the course on child psychology.

Registration for fall quarter will begin Monday (Sept. 12) and continue through Sept. 23 at the General Extension Division's Duluth office in the New Garrick building, 128 W. 1st Street. Tuition for the three credit course is \$33.00. Information on textbooks will be given at the time of registration.
