Duluth-- Two music workshops -- one featuring Roger Tenney, 1966-67 National Teacher of the Year -- will be held during the first summer session at UMD.

Tenney, head of the Choral Music Department at Owatonna High School, will be on the faculty for the June 10-21 Choral Director's Workshop.

An Instrumental Music Clinic will run concurrently from June 10-14. Both are sponsored by the University of Minnesota General Extension Division.

The choral workshop will be for music teachers, students and church choir directors. Material to be covered includes conducting techniques, vocal teaching techniques, rehearsal techniques, music interpretation and suggested repertoires.

Participants in the choral workshop may earn an optional three graduate or undergraduate credits in the Music Education 140.

The noncredit instrumental music clinic will focus on band scoring and orchestration. Considerable time will be devoted to football band scoring, as well as stage band directing.

Besides being selected Teacher of the year, Tenney was honored by the School Musician magazine as one of the 10 most outstanding musicians in America during 1966-1967. He is also on President Johnson's Education Scholarship Committee.

Other faculty members for the workshop include James Murphy and Barry McDonald.

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Murphy is professor and head of the UMD Department of music and conductor of bands and orchestras. He will be on the faculty for both workshops.

McDonald is assistant band director and arranger for the Pride of the Southland Marching Band and instructor in theory and arranging at the University of Tennessee. McDonald will be on the instrumental clinic faculty.
