MINNESOTA HISTORICAL SOCIETY HISTORIC TRIPS

The development of the town of St. Anthony as a milling center in pioneer days and the beginnings of the University will be discussed in connection with the fifth and last of the series of historic trips which the Minnesota Historical Society has been conducting this summer on the trip around Old St. Anthony, the earliest settled part of Minneapolis, this afternoon. A visit to Ard Godfrey House, built in 1848, will be included in the trip.

The curator of the Historical Society Museum, who will be in charge, will leave the Historical Building, St. Paul, at 2:00, reaching the corner of Third avenue and Fourth street southeast, Minneapolis, about 3:00. Persons desiring to go may meet him at either place. All who are interested are cordially invited.

ATTENTION OF SUMMER SCHOOL STUDENTS

For the information of those students who desire to continue work through the five weeks following the regular summer session the following courses will be offered, provided that a sufficient number of students present themselves for a course, to insure the payment of all expenses of course from fees from students.

Students will be allowed to carry only one course during

this continuation period, except by special permission.

New students will be required to pay all fees, including registration, deposit, health and tuition fees.

Students continuing from the present six weeks' session will be required to pay the tuition fees printed in today's Official Bulletin.
