Seniors who expect to receive their degrees at the Commencement Exercises, Thursday, December 19, are asked to note carefully the following items of information:

Academic costume—Candidates for degrees will appear in Cap and Gown as usual. Those who have not purchased gowns may rent them at the Perine Book Company, the Minnesota Co-op, and the Engineer's Book Store for \$1.50 for the week.

It is recommended that the women wear uniform white collars, gunmetal hose and dark shoes; the men, white collars, dark ties and dark shoes.

Rehearsal—On Thursday, December 19, at 9:30 o'clock, candidates will meet on the stage in the Northrop Memorial auditorium to rehearse the formalities of the occasion and to receive final instructions.

GRADUATE SCHOOL

Professor W. Spielmeyer, of the University of Munich, Germany, will speak on "The Local Factor in the Electivity of Disease Processes in the Nervous System," under the auspices of the Graduate School, on Tuesday, December 17, in the Anatomy Amphitheater, at 4 p.m.

The following new courses in Animal Genetics and Poultry Husbandry have been approved for graduate credit:

101w. Advanced poultry breeding: Principles of genetics applied to poultry breeding; a survey of inheritance in the fowl; fecundity, physiology of reproduction in the fowl. Prerequisite: Plant Genetics 131 and Poultry 2, or equivalents. 3 credits. Ar. Mr. Hutt.

202. Animal Genetics: Assigned readings and lectures in-breeding, hybridization, lethal factors, disease resistance, sex ratio, the physiology of gene action and other phases. Prerequisite (or concurrently with) Plant Genetics 245. 8 credits. Ar. Mr. Hutt.

203f,s. Seminar in Animal Genetics: Review of current literature and discussion of special topics. 1 credit per quarter. Ar. Mr. Hutt.

204f,w,s. Seminar in Poultry Husbandry: Review of important investigations in the biology of the fowl. 1 credit per quarter. Ar. Mr. Hutt.
