DULUTH--Fifty-five northeastern Minnesota high school principals have been invited to a high school-UMD transition conference on the Duluth campus Thursday (April 24).

Approximately 200 UMD freshmen have been invited to visit with their former principals. Minneapolis campus personnel also will participate.

Headed by Robert J. Falk, assistant director, office of student personnel services, a UMD committee has arranged a discussion program embracing various transition problems.

Addressing the opening session at 9:30 a.m. in Kirby Student center ballroom will be Kenneth L. Pederson, Hibbing high school principal, and Chester W. Wood, director, UMD OSPS.

William Van Evera, chairman, Duluth Chamber of Commerce education and social welfare committee, and Academic Dean Thomas W. Chamberlin will address the luncheon session, co-sponsored by the C of C.

A coffee hour sponsored by the women's department of physical education under leadership of Miss Ruth Richards will conclude the session at 2:30 p.m.

"By visiting with students in their first year at UMD, their high school principals and UMD personnel can be guided in better fulfilling new student needs in succeeding years," Mr. Falk explained.

Among subjects are curriculum and instruction, admission problems, orientation, registration, housing, guidance, student life and activities, credit loads, part time work and school expenses.
