DULUTH -- Mrs. Dolores Langdon, an instructor in music, will present a recital at 8:15 p.m. Tuesday (Nov. 8) in Recital Hall in the UMD Humanities building.

Mrs. Langdon, a mezz-soprano, will be accompanied by Shirley Munger, an associate professor of music, in a varied program of songs and arias.

The program, open free to the public, will include selections from "Orfeo" by Gluck and "Samson and Dalila" by Saint-Saens along with the song cycle "A Woman's Life and Love" (Frauenliebe und Leben) by Robert Schumann.

American songs will include two works by Dr. Charles Hamm, who currently serves on the faculty of the University of Illinois, to texts by the American poet e. e. cummings. (correct)

Mrs. Langdon has previously taught at Eastern Illinois University and the University of Missouri at Columbia. She sang professionally with the Robert Shaw Chorale and the Choral Art Society of New York in addition to holding various church solo positions in Cleveland and New York.

Her undergraduate degree from Seton Hill College in Greensburg, Pa. was followed by graduate work at the Cleveland Institute of Music and the University of Illinois.

Mrs. Langdon has appeared in numerous solo recitals and operatic performances and has sung in a solo capacity with the Cleveland Orchestra under the direction of Robert Shaw.

Mrs. Langdon's husband, John, is a psychologist with the Duluth Mental Hygiene Clinic.
