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DULUTH -- A four day Orientation Session for Teachers and Aides in the Summer Head-Start Programs will be held Monday through Thursday (June 12-15) at the UMD Laboratory School.

Participants from Cook, Lake, St. Louis, and Pine counties, Duluth, Superior and Northern Wisconsin will be preparing for their respective Head-Start programs which begin June 19.

The session is being sponsored by the University of Minnesota, Duluth, the University's Minneapolis campus, and the Institute of Child Development in Minneapolis.
