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Duluth--- A Clothing Clinic to inform home economists on what's new in fashion and fabrics will be held at UMD Monday and Tuesday (July 18-19).

The series of lectures and demonstrations will be conducted in Room 70 of the Home Economics building. The clinic is co-sponsored by the University General Extension Division and the UMD Department of Home Economics.
