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DULUTH -- Four visiting lecturers have been announced for the NDEA Institute for Secondary School Teachers of English scheduled for the University of Minnesota, Duluth (UMD) campus from July 18-August 19.

Forty teachers from Minnesota and northern Wisconsin will be selected to attend the Institute, according to Dr. Anna L. Stensland, UMD associate professor of English and institute director.

Dr. Robert C. Pooley, professor of English at the University of Wisconsin (Madison) will speak July 28 on "Curriculum Planning."

The author of four very popular English texts, Dr. Pooley serves as director of the Wisconsin English Curriculum Project. He is a former president of the National Council of Teachers of English.

A former UMD faculty member Dr. Leonard Wolf will talk about "Teaching the Poem" from August 4-9. He presently is professor of English at San Francisco State College.

On August 18, ~~REX~~ Dr. Martin Steinmann will speak on "Rhetoric and the Teaching of High School Writing." He is professor of English at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis.

The final lecture will be delivered by Dr. Donald K. Smith, professor of speech and rhetoric at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. He will talk ~~on~~ July 25 on "What is New About the 'Rhetoric'?"

Institute participants will attend two courses (The Arts of Reading and The Arts of Composition), a twice weekly seminar for a detailed discussion of short literary works, demonstrations of materials in teaching composition and literature and a workshop to discuss teaching problems.

The Institute faculty will include Dr. William Rosenthal, Dr. Wendell Glick, Dr. Lewis D. Levang and Mr. Fred Schroeder from the UMD English Department.
