UNDER the auspices of the American Council of Education, a Mission composed of some of the leading scholars of France has arrived in this country. Three members of the Mission will visit the University of Minnesota on December 6. One or more members of the Mission will lecture at the University. All of them speak English well and the lectures are intended to appeal to the general public.

The members of the Mission who are to appear at the University are as follows:

Professor Theodore Reinach, Editor of the "*Gazette des Beaux-Arts*," Lt.-Colonel in the French Army, who has contributed several important studies to the History of Greece and whose magazine is the most important French review dealing with the study of Ancient and Modern Art. He is a member of the "Institut de France, Academie des Inscriptions et Belles Lettres."

Dr. Etienne Burnet, of the Pasteur Institute (Paris), Surgeon in the French Army. He is a member of the Pasteur Institute as a specialist in microbiology.

Lieutenant Seymour de Ricci, art critic and former Editor of "*Art in Europe*." He is a distinguished scholar and lecturer on the history of art.

ON MONDAY, December 2, Miss Helen M. Bennett, manager of the Chicago Collegiate Occupational Bureau, will speak to all University women in the Little Theater at 12:55. The subject of her talk will be, "Opportunities for College Women." Miss Bennett was one of the most inspiring speakers at the vocational conference which was held here under the auspices of the W. S. G. A. two years ago. Girls who wish to have a personal conference with Miss Bennett should make appointments at once through the office of Miss Ball, Vocational Adviser for Women. There is, of course, no charge whatsoever either for the lecture or for a personal conference.

Professor Scott will be there with plenty of lively songs and will lead the singing.
