DULUTH--An internationally known expert in the field of protein chemistry will make two public appearances at UMD Thursday and Friday(Nov.21-22).

Dr. Rufus Lumry, professor of chemistry at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, will speak on "Home Proteins as Complex Ions" before a joint meeting of the Lake Superior section of the American Chemical Society and the UMD Sigma Xi Club at 8:00 p.m. Thursday(Nov.21) in Science-Mathematics 206.

He will discuss "The Dynamics of Proteins and Protein Models" at a UMD chemistry department student-faculty seminar at 3:30 p.m. Friday (Nov.22) in Science 251.

Dr. Lumry received his Ph.D. degree in chemical physics from Harvard University in 1949. He has been on the University of Minnesota staff since 1950. His research activities have covered reactions of proteins, photosynthesis, chemiluminescence, and rates of electron transfer reactions.
