MINNESOTA VS. NORTHWESTERN

NOVEMBER 13, 1937—HOMECOMING

Northwestern University played its first scheduled game with Minnesota in 1892. Today's game will be the 20th meeting of these two teams. Of the 19 previous games, Minnesota has won 11, lost 6 and tied 2. In the series of games, Minnesota has scored 190 points against 81 for Northwestern.

Last year, at Dyche Stadium, Evanston, Illinois, Northwestern defeated Minnesota 6 to 0 before a capacity crowd at a game played in a drizzling rain, and then went on to win the Conference Championship. A Conference Championship depends on the result of today's game, as Minnesota has not been defeated by a Conference team.

Approximately 7,000 alumni and students from Northwestern University are in the stands. The welcome to this group, to the 135 piece Northwestern University Band, and to Minnesota's alumni and students will be given by Governor Elmer A. Benson. He will speak from a position on the playing field just in front of the west goal posts at 1:45.

The faculty, the administrative staff, the Department of Athletics and the student body join with Governor Benson in welcoming back old grads and in extending greetings to Northwestern students and alumni.

Last Home Game—Wisconsin, Dad's Day—November 20

Tickets are still available in the concrete stands for this game. Public sale will open at Field-Schlick's Ticket Office in Saint Paul, at the Downtown Ticket Office in the Northwestern Bank Building in downtown Minneapolis and at the ticket window in the Athletic Building, Monday morning, November 15. About 5,000 Wisconsin students and alumni are expected to visit Memorial Stadium for this last game of the 1937 season.

NATIONAL INTERCOLLEGIATE TRACK MEET—JUNE 16 and 17, 1938

Attention is called to this outstanding track event which brings together more college and Olympic track stars than any other single track meet held in the United States. This meet is being held for the first time in the Middle West at the University of Minnesota.

Prices: Friday, \$1.00, including tax; Saturday, \$1.50 including tax; two day season ticket, \$2.00. General admission seats will be sold in the bowl at \$0.55 both days. All seats on the sides near the start and finish lines are reserved, and may be ordered by mail. Ticket applications will be accepted at once. Attendance of from fifteen to twenty thousand persons is expected for this greatest of all track meets.

Indicate your intention to return to the gatemen and obtain from them a pass-out check. This check will be required in addition to your ticket stub in order to re-enter the Stadium.
