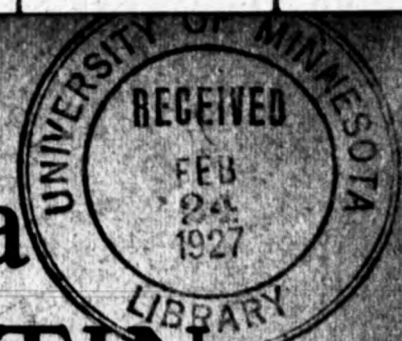

#### Registration Notice

- All students taking freshman work, Physical Education 2w, must continue with Course 3s in the spring quarter without change of time.
- All students who entered the University this winter quarter and students entering the University spring quarter who are to take freshman work register for Physical Education 3s.
- A student taking sophomore work may elect any sophomore course provided she has passed the swimming test.\* Otherwise she must take elementary swimming 22s, this spring quarter.

\*Swimming tests will be given 9th hour on Feb. 25, March 1, 2, 4, 8.
