DULUTH. . . Seventy Northern Minnesota credit union leaders already have registered for the one-day Consumer Credit Seminar planned at UMD Saturday. (March 25.)

"The number is considerably above what we expected," said R. Kay Humphrey, program director. Humphrey represents the University of Minnesota's Center for Continuation Study, which is conducting the seminar in cooperation with the Minnesota League of Credit Unions and the University in Duluth.

Dr. Richard O. Sielaff, chairman of UMD's Social Sciences division, is keynote speaker. His talk, "The Economic Future of Minnesota," is scheduled for 9:20 a.m. in the Social Sciences building.

Two other faculty members, Cecil H. Meyers and John A. Dettmann, professors of business and economics at UMD, are on the program. An afternoon panel will feature the views of educators, and personnel in the areas of cooperatives, public service, mining, and miscellaneous industries.
