CONFERENCE ON LETTERS AND SCIENCE-----Undergraduate scholarly papers, creative work, and research projects are all eligible for presentation at the first annual "Student Perspectives: Conference on Letters and Science" to be held Monday, April 23, at the University of Wisconsin-Superior. Undergraduate students from every institution in the Lake Superior Association of Colleges and Universities are eligible. The best presentation in each of three divisions (natural sciences, social sciences, and humanities) will receive an award of \$100.

Faculty members are requested to notify their students that the deadline for submitting entries is this week. Abstracts, descriptions, or a copy of the paper should be submitted to Dr. Nancy Minihan, Department of Psychology, University of Wisconsin-Superior, Superior, Wisconsin 54880. A maximum of ten entries will be chosen for presentation in each division.

The conference will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in Room 138 of the Rothwell Student Center.

GEOLOGY SEMINARS-----The following seminars will be held in Life Science 185 at 3:30 p.m.:
Monday, March 26 - Mr. Robert Bauer, Macalester College, St. Paul, will speak on "Multiple deformation in schists of the western Vermilion District, Minnesota."

Wednesday, March 28 - Mr. Terry Klein, Colorado School of Mines, Golden, Colorado, will present "Precambrian geology and geochemistry of Seminoe Mountains, Carbon County, Wyoming."

Friday, March 30 - "Volcanology of the central Noranda area - an Archean shield volcano" is the topic of a speech by Dr. Roy Shegelski, Lakehead University, Thunder Bay, Ontario, Canada.

HILL VISITING PROFESSOR-----Dr. Nathaniel J. Pallone has been appointed Hill Visiting Professor at UMD for the Spring Quarter. Nat is professor of education and psychology at Rutgers University where he serves as Dean of University College and Associate Vice-President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Pallone will deliver three public lectures during the quarter organized around the theme, "Psychological and Social Services and the Structure of Values." The dates for these public lectures are April 4, April 25, and May 16 in Tweed Museum at 8 p.m.

In addition, Nat will conduct a series of informal seminars for students and faculty members in the behavioral and social science units focused on topics related to the social sciences and criminal justice systems which have been the subject of his recent research. Dates for the seminars are March 27, April 3, April 10, April 17, April 24, May 1, May 8, May 15, and May 22. Meeting time is from 2 to 4 p.m. in Room 120, Bohannon Hall.
