## ALL-UNIVERSITY CONVOCATION

This Morning at 11:30 in the University Armory

Speaker: DR. HARRY EMERSON FOSDICK, of Union Theological Seminary,  
New York City

I wish to say a personal word about Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick of New York City, who is to be our convocation speaker this morning at 11:30 in the Armory. I have known Dr. Fosdick for years and regard him as among the very best speakers to college students that our country affords. He speaks regularly at Harvard, Yale, and many other Eastern universities, where his popularity is unquestioned. He has remarkable skill as a platform orator. He thinks clearly and with great precision. He has a genuine grasp upon the tremendous problems which now confront us. I trust that the University will give him a large and representative hearing.

THIS EVENING at 8:15 in Room 225, Chemistry Laboratory, Dr. W. D. Richardson, Chief Chemist of Swift and Company, will give a talk on "The Chemistry, Technology, and Dietetics of Oleomargarine." Dr. Richardson is one of America's great industrial chemists as well as an authority on butter substitutes. The lecture is given under the auspices of the Minnesota Section of the American Chemical Society, and will be open to the public.

THE SPEAKER FOR THE TUESDAY LUNCHEON to be given January 28th, in Shevlin Hall, will be Miss Alma L. Binzel, who has been studying at Teachers' College, Columbia University. She will discuss briefly some phases of the proposed federal organization for education. Tickets must be obtained at the office of Dean Beggs not later than 11:00 o'clock of the day of the luncheon. Only fifty tickets are available and reservations should be made as early as possible. They are 25 cents each.
