Honorary Degree Recipients

Dr. William J. Hadlow

D.V.M. The Ohio State University - 1948

Dr. Hadlow began his career in graduate studies in the College of Veterinary Medicine and the Medical School in 1948. His professional work as a research pathologist was in the Public Health Service at the Rocky Mountain Laboratory, Hamilton, Montana.

A skilled comparative pathologist, he gained insights that enabled him to conduct critical experiments, making important contributions to knowledge of a large family of poorly understood neurologic disorders long before human medicine became involved. This group includes encephalopathy in mink, scrapie, sheep, wasting disease in elk, bovine spongiform encephalopathy BSE (mad cow disease) in cattle, and Kuru and Creutzfeld-Jacob disease in people.

His knowledge of human neuropathology, his demonstration of related animal neuropathology and his recommendation that subacute progressive brain disease should have infection as the etiologies, warranted his inclusion in either one or both of the Nobel Prizes awarded in the field of slow infection of the nervous system.

His early work on scrapie of sheep allowed British authorities to use his data to reduce the potential for food borne transmission of BSE to humans. With the emergence of BSE in Great Britain, U.S. authorities used his data in formulating regulations to prevent the introduction of BSE in the U.S. Dr. Hadlow has trained the pathologists responsible for the control of these diseases and in the diagnosis of scrapie and BSE.

Dr. Benjamin S. Pomeroy

D.V.M. Iowa State University - 1933

M.S. Cornell University - 1934

Ph.D. University of Minnesota 1944

A member of the faculty of the College of Veterinary Medicine for 47 years, Dr. Pomeroy served 20 years as department chair. He also served as Associate Dean and Acting Dean. An outstanding teacher in the professional graduate programs, he excelled in research and service.

His research laid the foundation for the control and eradication of several diseases of turkeys, namely *Salmonella typhimurium*, *Salmonella arizona*, *Mycoplasma gallisepticum*, *Salmonella synovia*, *Mycoplasma meleagridis*, avian influenza and coronavirus. These accomplishments have helped to place Minnesota as the leading turkey production state the last half of this century. He is recognized nationally and internationally for his expertise on eradication and control programs and has served on National Emergency Control programs for *Salmonella pullorum*, *Salmonella* in general, coronavirus, Newcastle disease and avian influenza. He was the principle poultry diagnostician for disease problems of poultry at the University as reflected in his research and service role in the state and nationally. His interaction between academia, government agencies, and industry is recognized through a listing of honors received, among which are the Ranelius Award for Outstanding Research and Service, the Alumni Merit Award, The Strange Award, and most recently the Siehl Prize for Excellence in Agriculture.
