Duluth--- The "Fiction to Film" English class at UMD will be viewing a series of classic films on Thursday nights during January and February. The films are open to the public.

Students in the winter quarter course are reading various novels, seeing film versions of those novels and then looking at and comparing the differences.

"The idea is to point up the differences of the two mediums, to look at the problems of adaptation and to look at the history of literature being made into films," explained Joseph Maiolo, associate professor of English at UMD, who teaches the course.

The course meets twice a week and the public is invited to attend the Thursday night film sessions. A \$1 donation will be asked for at the door. All films listed will be shown at 8 p.m. on Thursdays in Bohannon Hall 90 at UMD:

Feb. 12 "Far From the Madding Crowd," starring Alan Bates and Julie Christie

Feb. 19 "Agee" (a biography-documentary on the life of James Agee)
