BECAUSE of the sudden death of his mother, Dr. Hugh Black has cancelled his engagements at the University next week. There will be no convocation on Thursday, February 20.

CHARLES UPSON CLARK has been secured for next Tuesday afternoon to tell us the story of "How Italy Protected Her Works of Art" when the enemy was threatening the invasion which endangered Venice and other important art centers. Professor Clark has slides and also some "movie" films and will explain them from his intimate acquaintance with many phases of the war as it affected Italy. The auditorium of the Main Engineering Building has kindly been placed at the lecturer's disposal so that he may use the permanent "movie" machine there. The time is 4:30 and no admission will be charged.

THE speaker at the sixth Tuesday luncheon, to be given February 18 in Shevlin Hall, will be Charles Upson Clark, formerly director of the American Academy in Rome, who appeared in the city a short time ago under the auspices of the Woman's Club of Minneapolis. Mr. Clark will also speak in the auditorium of the Main Engineering Building at 4:30. Tickets for the luncheon will, as usual, be sold for 25c at the office of Dean Beggs, before 11:30 Tuesday.
