WOMEN IN MANAGEMENT The special concerns of women in management and the development and career growth of women will be the focus of a special four-day seminar from Sept. 29 to Oct. 2 in the Kirby Student Center Ballroom. The workshop may be taken for credit or non-credit. The seminar is designed for women considering employment, returning to school, exploring a career change, or for employed women who wish to enhance their career development. Persons wishing to take the workshop for two credits must register for Psy-3950 "Workshop in Psychology" at a cost of \$46 plus a \$4 material fee. The cost for persons participating in the workshop for non-credit is \$5 a day or \$20 for the entire four-day seminar. There are special rates and scholarships available. Registration will be allowed through the first day of the seminar but advanced registration is encouraged.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON FOOD, JUSTICE International experts from the United Nations, U.S. Department of State, U.S. Agency for International Development and the World Bank, plus representatives of the Caribbean Islands are among a host of people who will gather at UMD Sept. 21-23 for an "International Conference on Food and Justice." The conference will be held in the Kirby Student Center Ballroom and is sponsored by the School of Social Development. The symposium will focus on the Central American country of Belize. All sessions of the three-day conference are free and open to the public, though those persons wishing to attend are requested to register in advance by calling the School of Social Development, 7245.

MUSEUM CONFERENCE Museum administrators, educators and professionals from a seven-state area around the Great Lakes will converge Sept. 23-26 at the Normandy Inn for the 53rd Annual Midwest Museum Conference. The conference is hosted by several area museums including the Tweed Museum of Art, the Canal Park Museum, A.M. Chisholm Museum, the Lake Superior Museum of Transportation, Glensheen and the St. Louis County Heritage and Arts Center.

SIGRID MITCHELL MEMORIAL LECTURE John Ciardi, a visiting professor of English at UMD and a nationally known poet and author of more than 30 books, will be the speaker at the Sigrid Mitchell Memorial Lecture at 9 a.m. Monday, Sept. 29, in the Tweed Museum Lecture Gallery at UMD. The lecture series, which is sponsored by the Continuing Education and Extension Office (CEE), was established in 1977 by friends of Sigrid Mitchell. Mitchell participated in CEE women's seminars from 1962 until her death in 1977. The lecture is free and open to the public.
