DULUTH--Biblical and contemporary selections will be read by a UMD class in oral interpretation directed by Harold L. Hayes at 3:30 p.m. Sunday in Kirby Student center ballroom.

Open free to the public, the program will include two works by Archibald MacLeish, Pulitzer prize-winning poet. They are "Colloquy of States" and "To Make Men Free."

The group will read from the second and third chapters of Genesis and Psalms 1, 8, 121 and 24.

A selection of Japanese Haikku poetry and the dramatic eulogy to Lincoln, "Lonesome Train," written by Millard Lampell, will complete the program.

UMD student Jerry Music, Duluth, will accompany the group in one of the selections with the banjo and will join in the reading. Approximately 20 students will participate.
