COAL LEACHATE STUDY David Z. Gerhart, Biology, has received a \$40,091 grant from the Environmental Protection Agency for study of the effects of coal leachates on the aquatic environment. The study relates to possible effects on Lake Superior from a coal handling facility to be constructed in Superior.

BUILDING PLANNING FUNDS RELEASED Chairmen of the Minnesota House Appropriations Committee and the Senate Finance Committee late last week released \$75,000 for preparing schematic plans for a new medical school building at UMD. Their action followed official notification of HEW approval of a \$6.6 million grant to construct the building. HEW grant will cover 80 per cent of cost; remainder will be sought from the 1976 Minnesota Legislature.
