

DULUTH--George C. Wilson, Interlochen, Mich., vice president of Interlochen's famed national summer music camp and an outstanding orchestra and band director, will be clinician for a northeastern Minnesota honor band clinic at UMD Feb. 3.

Sponsored by the UMD music department, the all-day session in Kirby Student center ballroom will end with a free public concert by the honor band at 8 p.m. in the ballroom. UMD band director James R. Murphy will be the director.

A faculty member at Interlochen since 1946, Mr. Wilson has been guest instructor, conductor and adjudicator at leading educational institutions, music festivals and clinics of America.

He organized the first all-state band clinics in Kansas and Arizona and is past president of the Arizona Music Educators and Missouri Music Educators' associations.

He was for 10 years professor of music at the University of Missouri, and for seven years he conducted the Tucson Symphony orchestra.
