BAXTER RETIRES Lt. Col. Edward Baxter retires this month as head of the UMD Department of Aerospace Studies and the Air Force Reserve Officers' Training Corps (AFROTC) program after five years in that position. He also will retire from the U.S. Air Force after 28 years of service. Baxter will continue to teach on a part-time basis in the School of Business and Economics and in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department. The current detachment of cadets at UMD will honor Baxter with a formal parade and retirement ceremony at 3 p.m. on Friday (Oct. 16) in the Physical Education Building. Lt. Col. Richard Vosika will take over as new head of the department and AFROTC program.
