# UMC Men's Golf Adds Hebert to the Fold for 2015 Signing Class



**CROOKSTON, Minn.-** The University of Minnesota Crookston men's golf team announced the addition of **Brandon Hebert** (5-11, St. Ignace, New Brunswick/Ecole Mgr-Marcel-Francois-Richard) to a National Letter of Intent. Hebert joins six other student-athletes who have signed either National Letters of Intent or Institutional Letters of Intent to compete for Head Coach [Jason Tangquist](#) and the UMC men's golf team.

"I am very excited to add Brandon to our team," Tangquist said. "Brandon is a solid player who will bring a lot of experience to our squad having played on a high level across Canada."

Hebert joins **Brandon Brown** (6-6, Stanchfield, Minn./Braham Area H.S.), **Chris Cobler** (5-9, Boise, Idaho/Capital H.S.), **Nick Kennedy** (6-0, Lake Bronson, Minn./Kittson County Central H.S.), **David Marschinke** (6-0, Saint Paul, Minn./South St. Paul H.S.) and **Ricky Phillips** (5-7, Grand Forks, N.D./Northland Community and Technical College) as signees during the late signing period. **Ethan Johnson** (6-4, Roseau, Minn./Roseau H.S.) signed with the team during the early signing period.

The seven UMC signees will join returnees [Seth Heppner](#) (Sr., Crookston, Minn.) and [Reed Bohm](#) (Jr., St. Hilaire, Minn.) to give Coach Tangquist a roster of nine student-athletes for the 2015-16 season. The newcomers will look to replace seven seniors including All-Conference performers [Jesse Roscoe](#) (Sr., Big Stone City, S.D.) and [Matt McClure](#) (Sr., Grand Rapids, Minn.).

All signees are contingent upon admission to UMC and compliance with NCAA rules, including certification by the NCAA Eligibility Center. Everyone released today has signed their National Letter of Intent prior to release of information.

Brandon Hebert (5-11, St. Ignace, New Brunswick/Ecole Mgr-Marcel-Francois-Richard)

Hebert carded an 89 and 83 at the Maple Leaf Junior Golf Tour (MJT) Atlantic Canada Series at Royal Oaks Golf Course in 2012. He has also golfed in several other junior and New Brunswick Golf events during his young career.

Hebert is the son of Joanne and Darren Hebert and was born June 27, 1995. He plans to major in golf and turf management at UMC.
